

### SCHOOL NURSE NEWS..... P-H-M IN PARTNERSHIP WITH SAINT JOSEPH REGIONAL MEDICAL CENTER

As colder weather and flu season approaches, here are some guidelines for when to keep your child home from school until your health care provider can be contacted for his/her opinion:

- A <u>fever</u> of 100 degrees or higher before school in the morning- do not have the student return to school until the student has been fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications.
- A "<u>heavy cold or hacking cough</u>" even without a fever (cough that disturbs normal activity)
- Diagnosis from physician of <u>Whooping Cough/Pertusis</u>-student should stay home from school until he/she has received 5 full days worth of antibiotic treatment.
- <u>Vomiting</u>- student should stay home until he/she can keep food down and is free of <sup>[]</sup> symptoms for 24 hours.
- <u>Diarrhea-student should remain home until free of symptoms for 24 hours.</u>
- <u>Pink eye</u> (conjunctivitis)-there can be many causes for red eyes, not all of which are communicable. Refer to your health care provider for an evaluation. The Academy of Pediatrics advises that children with purulent conjunctivitis (defined as pink or red conjunctiva with white or yellow discharge, often with matted eyelids after sleep and eye pain or redness of the eyelids or skin surrounding the eyes) be excluded until examined by a health care provider and approved for readmission. With bacterial conjunctivitis, health care providers usually recommend exclusion until 24 hours after starting topical antibiotic therapy.
- <u>Strep throat</u>-student can return to school after they have been on antibiotics for at least 24 hours and are fever free.
- <u>Chicken pox</u>-exclusion from school for one week after the first eruption appears <u>or</u> all lesions are dry and crusted
- <u>Unexplained rash, blisters, or draining sores-student should see his/her health care provider for a diagnosis.</u>

Many illnesses are most communicable at the beginning. If your child is kept home, fewer children will be exposed to the illness. Allowing your child to stay home and get well at the beginning of an illness will actually help him/her to be more successful in school and lose less school time in the long run.

Remember- good hygiene and good hand washing techniques can help to prevent many illnesses!

Call your health care provider with any concerns during an illness!

### NOTIFICATION OF ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT PLAN

The requirements of Public Law 99-519 better known as the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) have been met by the Penn-Harris-Madison School Corporation.

Following an inspection for asbestos containing material by an accredited inspector, Penn-Harris-Madison had an approved asbestos management plan on July 9 1989. The plan and all records concerning its implementations are available for inspections at the office of the principal during regular business hours.
